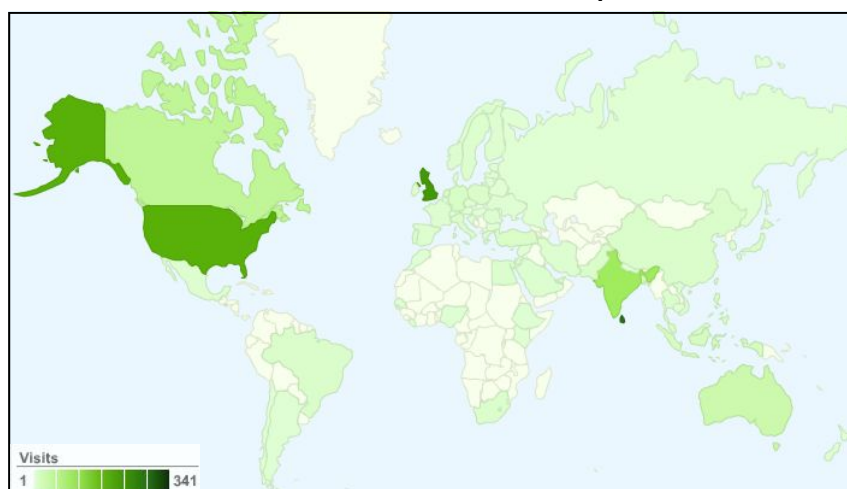
Visitors to SLJOL

Google Analytics shows that from 23 September—31 December 2008, there were 1,364 visits from 82 countries. The graph below shows visits since SLJOL was launched. It indicates that there has been an overall increase in the number of visits but the site needs to be more actively used by the readers and authors of the journals, and more journals need to be included.

Visitors to SLJOL came from 82 countries: the top three sources for visitors were: Sri Lanka (341 from 4 cities), UK (259 from 51 cities) and USA (217 from 174 cities).

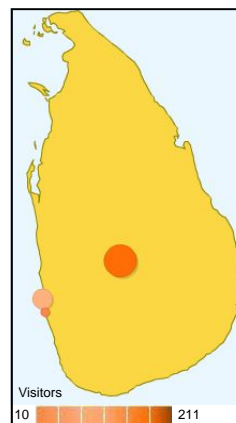


Global distribution of visitors to SLJOL 23 Sept—31 Dec 2008

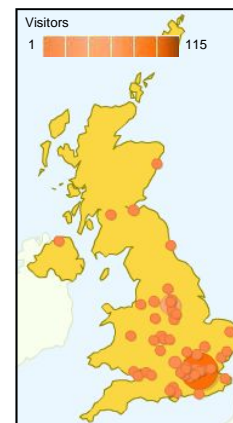


1,364 visits from 82 countries/territories

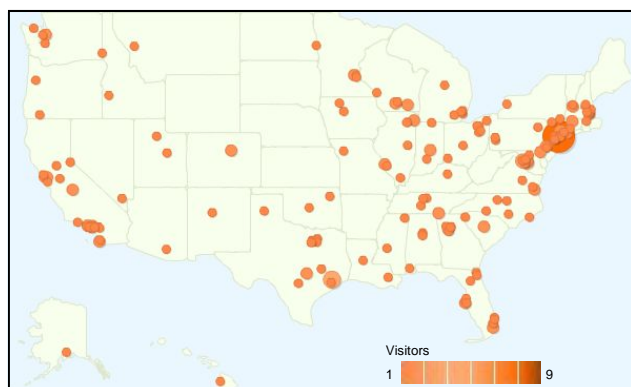
Location of visitors from Sri Lanka—341 from 4 cities



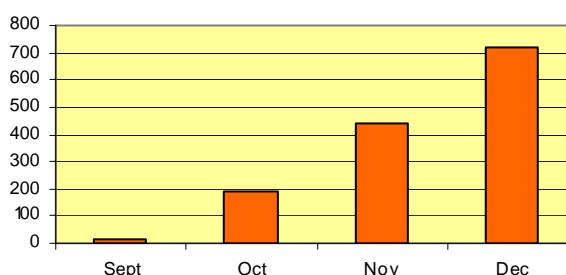
Location of visitors from the UK—259 from 51 cities

Number of views

At the end of December 2008, there 28 issues and 257 articles of which 218 were full text. This is a good start, but it is important that the journals keep sending their new issues to be loaded so that the momentum of usage on the site can grow.

The chart below shows the number of views of full text articles for the SLJOL journals from Sept to Dec 2008. 7,417 articles were viewed during this period. *Sri Lanka Journal of Child Health* has the highest (4,890). The graph also shows the average number of views per article for each journal and *the Sri Lanka Journal of Child Health* also has the highest with 445. The full text for the *Journal of the National Science Foundation of Sri Lanka* was only added in 2009 and therefore is not reflected on this graph.
