Biography:

Jennifer is an International Programme Manager with 10 years' experience in managing multi-disciplinary and multi-stakeholder projects in the NGO, private and public sectors. Specialising in higher education, research and gender, she has extensive background managing overseas partners and projects, and has been recognized for her ability to build effective and strong international partnerships.

In 2018, she took on the role of Project Manager for the Transforming Employability for Social Change in East Africa (TESCEA) project. Previously, she acted as the Programme Manager for Research and Communication at INASP, managing the AuthorAID programme to support the capacity of researchers in low and middle-income countries to communicate and publish their research. Through AuthorAID, she coordinates 10 institutional partners in 4 countries, and a global network of 17,000 researchers. She also coordinates a stream of work supporting women researchers to address inequalities in their institutions through gender mainstreaming.

Jennifer spent the previous four years at the Institute and Faculty of Actuaries in London, a role which included developing research best practice and quality assurance, supporting the development of actuarial research with 300 researchers worldwide. Holding an MA in Education and International Development from UCL Institute of Education, she also spent five years working in education strategy at the Royal College of Physicians of Canada and, since 2010 has also coordinated a girls' education programme in Togo through a Canada-Togo non-profit partnership.
