The competition was part of our Research Writing in the Sciences online course in which we challenged participants to share a picture and story of them conducting research. ### Mentoring for women researchers

AuthorAID recognises the additional barriers for women researchers in accessing support. Through our mentoring work, alongside our partner Organization for Women in Science for the Developing World (OWSD), and our MOOCs we have supported thousands of women researchers to access training, grants, and other support. Women represent 37% of AuthorAID mentees and 32% of mentors. And 50% of our MOOC completers are women.

### Online courses – 2021 in numbers

There were **7,596** participants and **2,819** completers in the three MOOCs. Participants came from **99** countries.

The top six countries represented by completers were:

	Nigeria (686)		Kenya (214)
	Uganda (276)		Tanzania (199)
	Vietnam (284)		Ethiopia (173)

MOOC course completers reported a **58%** increase in confidence for the 10 key topics in research writing.

The top areas in confidence increase were:

- 1) Dealing with peer reviewer comments
- 2) Distinguishing between suspicious and trustworthy journals, and
- 3) Identifying a suitable target journal

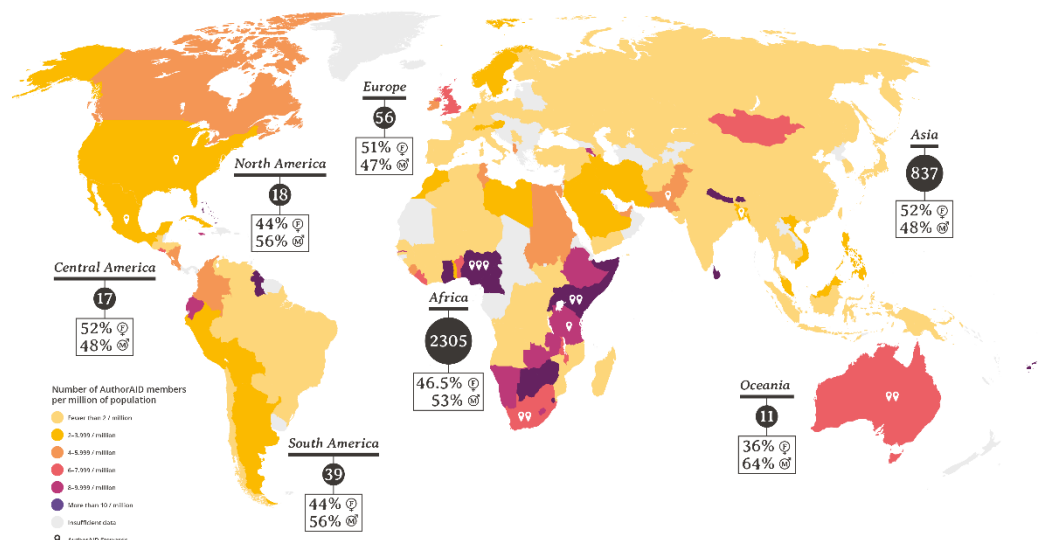
## Global spread of AuthorAID membership
