Policy statement

INASP is committed to a zero-tolerance approach to any form of modern-day slavery or human trafficking. This applies to its own business and also within its partner organisations. As an organisation with over 30 years' experience of working with a global network of partners in Africa, Latin America and Asia, INASP understands its responsibility to combat modern-day slavery in all forms.

This statement sets out the steps that INASP has taken to ensure that modern-day slavery does not occur within our own or our partner's business.

Our organisation, business and supply chains

INASP is an international development organisation with over 30 years' experience of working to ensure that research and knowledge are at the heart of development. With our partners, INASP works to strengthen the capacity of individuals and institutions to produce, share and use research and knowledge, in support of national development.

INASP is a registered charity structured as a company limited by guarantee (Company No. 04919576, registered charity number 1106349), governed by a board of trustees.

Our partners and supply chain

INASP works with a global network of individuals and partner organisations in the Global North and the Global South ranging from universities to government institutions.

Our supply chain comprises of:

- Local partner organisations and self-employed consultants located globally, who work with us
 to implement our programme work, ensuring we invest and empower the local communities as
 far as possible, and
- Operational support suppliers located globally, who provider services to the business at an operational and project level.

We follow a robust due diligence process when evaluating future working relationships, as a part of this INASP ensures all partners and suppliers are aware of our policies on Safeguarding and Whistleblowing.

INASP will not work with any party we suspect is connected in any way with slavery and will terminate contracts at any time should any instances of modern slavery emerge.
